

Rabbit, Hare, and Bunny are roommates. But sometimes roommates don't get along.




In this fun and whimsical Christmas story, can the reader find the trail to Santa's suit? Will Sophie's selfies save the day?

Lighthearted in its approach, but powerful in its message, A Girl Named October tells a story that will spur conversations with children and adults alike.




